EARLY START SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the District 509 Board of Trustees to recognize superior individual achievement in academics, this scholarship is awarded to high school juniors and seniors who are in the top 10 percent of their class or are one of the top three students. It is a non-competitive award, covering in-district tuition only, six credit hours maximum per semester.

Please read the entire application for details about this scholarship. Terms and conditions stated in this application are effective Fall 2014.

- Apply by May 1 for priority processing for fall.
- Apply by November 1 for priority processing for spring.

APPLICATION CRITERIA TO QUALIFY FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP, YOU MUST:

1. Be a resident of Community College District 509 for at least 30 days immediately prior to the start of the first semester to which the scholarship applies; rank in the upper 10 percent of your class (using weighted ranking, if used by your high school) at the time of application or be one of the top three students, whichever is greater; and be enrolled in one of the high schools listed below:

4. Be in good financial standing with all ECC departments (no outstanding balances or financial restrictions).
5. Submit a one-page essay (personal statement) that details your educational plans, career goals, and past involvements in high school and community activities. Make sure to include your name on the essay.
6. Provide written approval from the school counselor/principal AND parent/guardian. Home-schooled students must have written parental or guardian permission.

NOTE:

- Be sure to attach your one-page essay to your application. Incomplete applications will not be processed.
- It is your responsibility to follow up on the status of your application to ensure it is approved prior to the payment deadline date of the term for which you are applying.

TO MAINTAIN AND RENEW THE SCHOLARSHIP FOR UP TO TWO YEARS, YOU WILL:

1. Maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 (B) at ECC, and remain in the upper 10 percent of your high school class (using weighted ranking, if used by your high school).
2. Be in good financial standing (no outstanding balances or financial restrictions) with all ECC departments.
3. Maintain in-district residency for the duration of the scholarship period.
4. Maintain appropriate standards of conduct as detailed at elgin.edu/codeofconduct.
5. Student must re-apply each year.

Important: This is a tuition-only scholarship, and covers tuition charges at the in-district rate for COMPLETED college-level courses. Courses covered under this scholarship are Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) certified courses – 100 level and above - (learn more about IAI courses at elgin.edu/universitytransfer, under online transfer tools). Scholarship covers a maximum of six (6) credit hours in any one semester, and can be used in fall, spring, and summer semesters. The duration of the scholarship cannot exceed five consecutive semesters, for a maximum of 30 credit hours. You are responsible for any enrollment fees, lab fees, and/or course fees prior to the payment deadline date. Books and classroom supplies are not covered by the scholarship. TOP 10/20 PERCENT ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by the District 509 Board of Trustees to recognize superior individual achievement in academics among graduating high school seniors who live in-district. It is a non-competitive award.

- Top 10 percent - \$2,000 scholarship per year for up to two consecutive years, fall and spring terms only – awarded to graduating high school seniors who achieve a rank in the upper 10 percent of their graduating classes.
- Top 20 percent - \$1,000 scholarship per year for up to two consecutive years, fall and spring terms only – awarded to graduating high school seniors who achieve a rank in the upper 20 percent of their graduating classes.

- Apply by May 1 for priority processing for fall.
- Apply by November 1 for priority processing for spring.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

TO QUALIFY FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP, YOU MUST:

2. Home-schooled students must submit ACT scores for evaluation. An ACT composite score of 26 minimum is required to be considered for top 10 percent scholarship eligibility. An ACT composite score of 24 minimum is required to be considered for top 20 percent scholarship eligibility.
3. Attend an ECC new student orientation and provide official seventh semester transcripts to the Admissions Office. Contact the Admissions Office to arrange an orientation date and time, 847-214-7385.
4. Submit a final/official high school transcript to the ECC Admissions Office. The official transcript, with weighted class ranking, must be on file prior to the scholarship being awarded.
5. Be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours and accepted in an associate degree program at ECC, unless a vocational certificate is the only available option. Non-credit courses do not satisfy credit requirement.
6. Be in good financial standing (no outstanding balances or financial restrictions) with all ECC departments.
7. Submit a one-page essay (personal statement) that details your educational plans, career goals, and past involvements in high school and community activities. Make sure to include your name on the essay.
8. Attend an academic scholars' orientation as indicated in the award letter.

It is your responsibility to follow up on the status of your application to ensure it is approved prior to the payment deadline date of the term for which you are applying. Incomplete applications will not be processed.

TO MAINTAIN AND RENEW THE SCHOLARSHIP FOR UP TO TWO CONSECUTIVE YEARS, YOU WILL:

1. Complete a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester in consecutive years; summer semester not covered. Only completed courses will be covered by the scholarship. Covers up to 12 hours of remedial classes over the course of the two year scholarship period.
2. Maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 (B).
3. Be in good financial standing with all ECC departments (no outstanding balances or financial restrictions).
4. Maintain in-district residency for the duration of the scholarship period.
5. Participate in 10 hours per semester (Top 10 Percent Scholarship) or five (5) hours per semester (Top 20 Percent Scholarship) of involvement at ECC as defined by the Academic Scholars Program. This involvement includes one college-wide event. Students are encouraged to actively participate in an ECC student club or organization as part of the required participation. Hours must be completed prior to the end of each term.
6. Maintain appropriate standards of conduct as detailed at elgin.edu/codeofconduct.

The Top 10 Percent Scholarship is for \$2,000 per year, up to two consecutive years. The Top 20 Percent Scholarship is for \$1,000 per year, up to two consecutive years. It can be used for tuition, lab fees, course fees, enrollment fee, and books (funds applied against outstanding charges in that order).

If you receive any form of state aid, that aid will be used first. Your Board of Trustees Scholarship will be applied next to cover eligible charges. Then, if you receive any form of federal need-based aid, excluding work-study and loan programs, or other scholarship funds, that aid will be applied last.

If you drop below full-time enrollment of at least 12 credit hours, you will forfeit the scholarship.

You may receive only one trustee scholarship in a period of 12 months. The maximum time period for a student to receive any combination of trustee scholarships is two consecutive years.

If you choose to apply for the need-based scholarship that may be awarded in conjunction with the academic scholarship, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA - fafsa.gov) in all scholarship years.



LEADERSHIP IN ATHLETICS SCHOLARSHIP

This competitive scholarship was established by the District 509 Board of Trustees to recognize superior individual achievement in athletics.

- Full-time pays for 12 credit hours of tuition only for up to two consecutive years, fall and spring terms only. Students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours to qualify.
- Half-time scholarship pays for six (6) credit hours of tuition only for up to two consecutive years, fall and spring terms only. Students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours to qualify.

LEADERSHIP IN CREATIVE WRITING AND FORENSICS SCHOLARSHIP

Forensics: (1) During an interview with the forensics advisor, show a five-minute video of a performance in your best event or give the performance at the interview. (2) Submit a letter of recommendation from your high school or college forensics coach if applicable, or from a high school or college instructor familiar with your work ethic.

Forensics: (1) Become a member of the ECC Forensics Team; (2) participate in at least three ECC Forensics Team events in at least two tournaments per semester; (3) meet with the forensics coach for a sufficient number of training sessions to compete effectively.

Music: (1) During a scheduled audition, play or sing two pieces in contrasting style, e.g., a 20th Century and a Romantic.
(2) Sight-read a piece of music.
Visual Art: Submit the following items for portfolio review: 10 black and white drawings or designs or 10 black and white photographic prints.

Music: (1) Rehearse and perform in at least two ECC performing groups, performing at all scheduled concerts each semester; (2) assist with some managerial responsibilities of these performing groups or the department as identified by your advisor; (3) enroll in private study through MUS 140/240 Applied Music (if deemed appropriate by you and your advisor for your growth as a musician); (4) assist with student recruitment.
Visual Art: (1) Assist with art gallery responsibilities, lab supervision and other departmental activities as assigned by supervising faculty; (2) assist with student recruitment.

The full-time scholarship is for \$1,000 per year for up to two consecutive years. The half-time scholarship is for \$500 per year for up to two consecutive years. The scholarships can be used for tuition, lab fees, course fees, enrollment fee, and books (funds applied against outstanding charges in that order).

If you receive any form of state aid, that aid will be applied to eligible charges first. Your Board of Trustees Scholarship will be applied next. Then, if you receive any form of federal need-based aid, excluding work-study and loan programs, or other scholarship funds, that aid will be applied last.

If you drop below full-time enrollment of at least 12 credit hours, or half-time enrollment of at least six (6) credit hours, you will forfeit the scholarship.

You may receive only one trustee scholarship in a period of 12 months. The maximum time period for a student to receive any combination of trustee scholarships is two consecutive years.
